It is also preferable to choose small shelves instead of large and somewhat long wardrobes. It is also preferable to take into account our choice of furniture.

Such as sofas and chairs, small sizes must be chosen that fit the space in which we live, taking into account the lines of movement and comfort. Increasing the floor space is one of the most important things to make the narrow space look beautiful and comfortable for us as users.

- 2- It is very important to choose the form of storage, as it is preferable to choose shelves instead of desks, and to place them above the beds or above the sofas in the living space, and you should avoid hanging huge ceiling chandeliers, as they do not seem practical at all in narrow apartments that usually have a low ceiling.
- 3- Lighting plays a very important role in small spaces, as it gives a beautiful appearance and the effect that the space is larger in area than it appears, so we must choose small residential spaces with large windows in order to benefit from natural lighting as much as possible, and if that is not within the available, then we resort to the trick. The second is the colors of the walls and the mirrors. We must choose light colors and shades of white, sugar, cream or beige, as the light colors give an impression of spaciousness and enlargement of the space. We must also not forget the use of mirrors that help the user feel the large space. Although it is originally a small space, mirrors also give an aesthetic appearance to the space.
- 4- Sometimes the apartment is a studio or open rooms without walls or doors. In these cases, there may be good space, but it will be difficult at that time to divide the space for each use, so you must try to allocate a specific corner for each activity. A corner for the dining table and another for the TV with the sofa, placing the furniture in a manner that determines your use of each corner, and if the bathroom is also small, transparent curtains must be used for the space of use, which gives a sense of space.
- 5- Putting some small home trees or greens helps to feel comfortable and gives a beautiful view inside the house, especially the small spaces.

3. ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES

One of the most important advantages of small residential units is that they are less energy consuming and more sustainable, also small spaces are easy to clean, which saves a lot of time for other daily activities. The design of small independent housing units is one of the most solid designs in terms of construction, ease of implementation, and the use of small spaces. 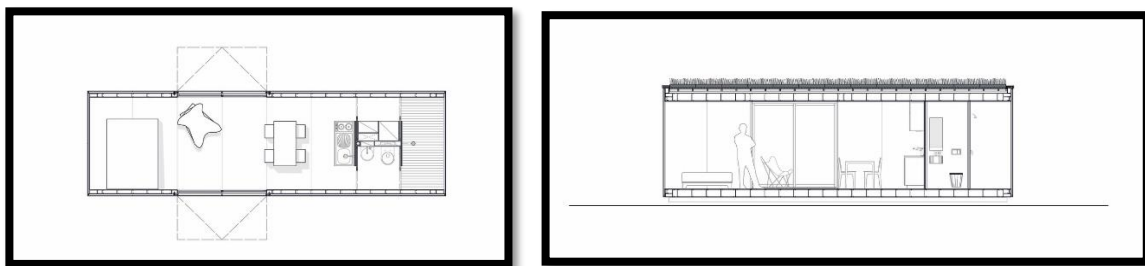


Fig. 1. shows, plan and section of the Minimod project,

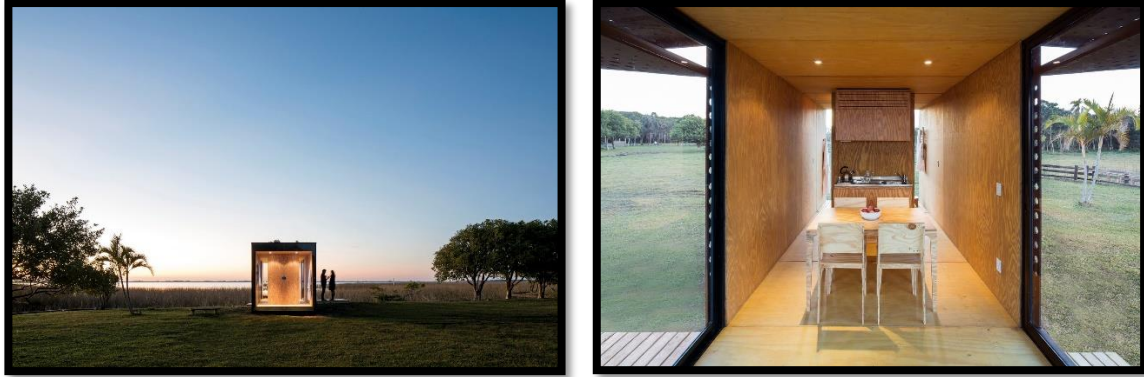


Fig. 2. shows, Exterior plan and Minimod project,

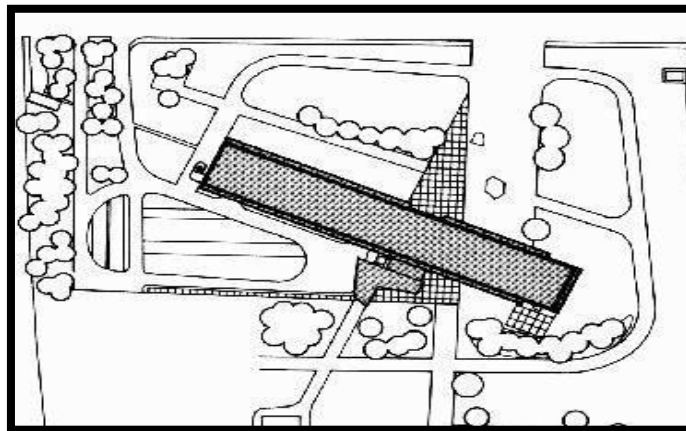


Fig. 4. shows, Exterior of Unite Habitation project,

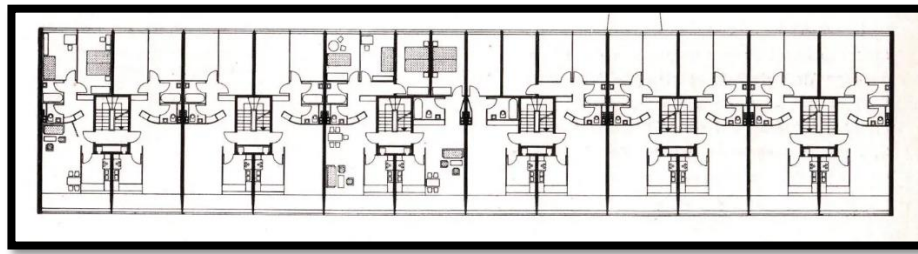


Fig. 5. shows, interior plan of Unite Habitation project,

Bolwoningen Project, or as the Fifty Ball Project is known, the project is located in the city of Dan Bosch in the Netherlands. At first glance, you feel as if you are somewhere in space or among the huge mushroom plants, but do not be afraid, these are small ball-shaped houses prepared for humans. The project was established in 1980 by the Dutch government. The project consists of fifty houses in the form of white balls made of cement, each with a diameter of 18 feet, and each of them has several windows, the number of which is more than ten.

The architect relied on white colors in the interior and exterior design, which suggests to users an expansion of space, and this is what must be taken into account in narrow spaces. Also, the designer adopted the use of furniture that complements the extension of the external shape, as most of the furniture was in the circular shape, from lighting to cabinets, furnishings, wall pictures, and windows as well.

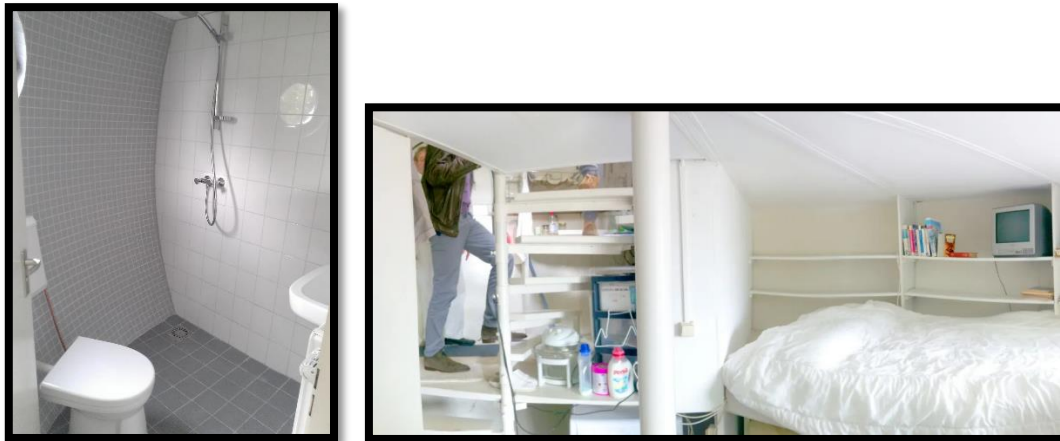


Fig. 9. shows Interior decorating of interior design,
